1. DISTRICT DISABLED REHABILITATION CENTRE (DDRC), BIRBHUM

A. Introduction

District Disability Rehabilitation Centre (DDRC) is an initiative by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India, to facilitate comprehensive services to Persons with Disabilities in respective District. We, as the Implementing Agency have setup the DDRC, Birbhum at Ratanpally, Santiniketan, Birbhum on March 2009 and from this time it is functioning under our care and under the supervision of District Management Team headed by the District Magistrate, Birbhum with firmly adopted objectives to serve the entire disabled population of Birbhum district. The main objectives of this centre is to provide all kind of rehabilitative supports to the Persons With Disabilities of any category under all ages which comprises various facilities such as, different therapeutic treatments like physiotherapy, speech therapy, psychotherapy, counseling service etc., assessment of needs and provision of Aids & Appliances to the Person With Disabilities, arrangement of surgical correction if needed, providing disability certificate through camp approach. In addition, the promotion of barrier free environment and awareness generation on prevention of Disabilities are the other main objectives of this centre.

B. Identification Camps for the Persons With Disabilities

During the year 2011-2012 two Identification Camps were organised for the disabled persons of all category at Birbhum for providing them with necessary Aids & Appliances. The main objective of such camp is to assist the needy disabled persons in procuring durable sophisticated and scientifically manufactured, modern, standard Aids & Appliances that can promote their physical, social and psychological rehabilitation, by reducing the effects of disabilities and enhance their economic potential.

E. Observation of World Disabled Day 2011

Among many global problems the problem of the children who need special help is a burning one and it has appealed all human souls that something has to be done for these helpless children. Apart from the Children, a special attention is also needed for the entire disabled population in social context. In fact, There are many aspects of problems which caused disability and affected the life people in many ways especially in the rural areas, such as, Child birth with disabilities are occurred due to low level of nutrition and healthcare provided to the pregnant mothers, which also caused by the lack of proper education and health consciousness etc. There is no doubt that large number of cases of disability is highly preventable and that can be prevented through providing information and by creating awareness among general people. By keeping this in mind, we have observed the World Disabled Day on 3rd December 2011 by undertaking different activities like Mass Awareness Rally, Sit & Draw and Poetry Recitation Competition for Disabled Children and Cultural Programme. 2. NAVODYAM SIKSHANIKETAN (A Special School for Disabled)

It is for the information of the people at large that this society is running a special school named Navodyam SikshaniKetan at it's premises at Ratanpally, Santiniketan. 24 disabled students coming from the fields of M.R, H.I, and V.I. are reading in this school. Four (4) special teachers are constantly imparting lessons to them for 3 hours and thrice in a week on Saturday, Sunday & Tuesday. It is more important to note that these disabled students are given vocational training here and rightly it may be expected that these disabled children will be able to earn their bread by themselves. An attempt has been taken to enrol many other disabled students here and to provide a scope of their prosecuting studies here.

3. NATIONAL CHILD LABOUR PROJECT (NCLP), BIRBHUM

It is beyond doubt that the child labours that belong to socio-economically backward family are prevailed in almost every part of rural, urban and semi-urban areas of our country as well as in Birbhum district. Due to poverty they are not in position to get formal education and other normal daily requirements. Therefore, in order to improve their worst condition, the Government of India launched the National Child Labour Project in all over the country including Birbhum district since 2006. Through this programme certain number (50) of child labours are provided with free primary level education up to class IV within the time span of 3 years under a non-formal school setup. After the completion of their study the child labours are mainstreamed in local formal schools to proceed with further study to upper level of education.

Our Society is involved with this programme since 2006 by running several Child Labour Schools in Birbhum district in support of the Birbhum District Child Labour Rehabilitation-Cum-Welfare Society under the Chairmanship of the Assistant Labour Commissioner, Suri, Birbhum. At this 2nd Phase of Project (2009-10 to 2011-12), 5 Child Labour Schools were running under our care at Maheshpur (Nalhati-I Block), Hazarpur (Nalhati-II Block), Mostafadanga (Nalhati-II Block), Atkula (Nalhati-II Block) and Sukbazar (Bolpur Block). Like previous years, total 25 staffs comprising 15 teaching and 10 non-teaching staff were engaged in this project and total 250 Child Labour Students have learned in these Schools. The school starts at the convenient time of the Pupils and classes continues for three and half hours. Besides imparting education several other facilities like Vocational Training, Monthly stipends to the students in favour of their Bank Account as supplementary income, and Nutrition was provided to them. From this session the Mid Day Meal Programme has been initiated like other formal schools, where the arrangement of Mid Day Meal is made by the respective BDOs and local SHG(s). Our organisation's responsibilities in this regard were to supervise the whole arrangement and ensure that the students can get proper and healthy meal along with their study.

At the end of December 2011, all the students of these schools were admitted in the upper classes of local formal schools after the successful completion of their study. Thus, SEVAKS has achieved a remarkable success in bringing those unprivileged children under the mainstream of our education system. It is expected that from the next session of 2012-2013 our organisation will get the opportunity to serve the Child Labours in different areas of our district through conducting Child Labour Schools under National Child Labour Project, Birbhum.

4. MASS AWARENESS & INFORMATION STALL AT SANTINIKETAN POUSH MELA; Abolishment of Child Labour and Ensuring Education for every Child

Poush Utsava of Santiniketan is 117 years old. Rabindranath Tagore's father Devendranath Tagore who was known as the Maharshi started the festival to mark the foundation of the Santiniketan Ashrama. The Poush Festival is internationally famous and near about 7-8 lakhs people come from different parts of our country as well as outside the country to enjoy the grand occasion of Poush Festival here at this renowned place of Santiniketan, which is coated with the memory of the World-Poet as well as Noble laureate Rabindranath Tagore. Aptly this is the most convenient place for spreading any kind of knowledge and information through sketches, pictures, data and cultural function.

In the Poush Mela of 2011 a Mass Awareness and Information Stall on the abolishment of Child Labour and ensuring education for every Child was organised from 23rd to 26th December 2011 in support of NCLP, Birbhum. 5. SELF HELP GROUPS

SHGs are currently seen as an essential and integral part not only of financial services delivery, but also as a channel for the delivery of non-financial services within larger objectives of livelihoods promotion, community development and women's empowerment. It has been realized in many parts of the world as well as in our country that an effective way to tackle poverty and to enable communities to improve the quality of life is the social mobilization of disadvantaged people, especially into Self Help Groups (SHGs). By the initiation of SEVAKS, many spouses of rural farmers by forming groups have been able to earn money creating an instance that woman also can earn money by running cottage industries in their homes. Presently, 15 SHG(s) are functioning under our care in the rural and tribal areas of Bolpur Block. The group members are trained on vocational planes like, food processing, kitchen garden, needle works, bamboo works.

6. PROMOTION OF VOLUNTARY BLOOD DONATION

A. Voluntary Blood Donation Camp Organisation

Every conscious person knows that there is always a dearth of blood bottles in Blood Bank. The main reason of it is that most people are still in superstition or fear in donating blood. SEVAKS is working in this area because it motivates people about blood donation. It is crystal clear to the medical men that there is an acute crisis of blood in 3 Sub-Divisional Govt. Blood Banks and SEVAKS has come forward to solve this problem through motivation and organizing voluntary blood donation camps even in the remotest corner of our district. In the year 2011-2012, SEVAKS has been able to procure 1840 units of blood from the motivated blood donors by organising 48 Voluntary Blood Donation Camps.

B. Seminar-cum-Workshops on Voluntary Blood Donation

On the occasion of World Blood Donor Day 2011, a Seminar-cum-Workshop on the motivation of Voluntary Blood Donor for the members of local voluntary organisations, students and health workers of this field was organised with the theme “More Blood. More Life”, in each Sub-Division of Birbhum District in support of State Blood Transfusion Council (SBTC) of West Bengal. These Seminar-cum-Workshops were organised on 18th, 20th and 25th of August 2011 at Suri District Hospital, Rampurhat SD Hospital and at Birbhum District Rice Mills’ Association’s conference hall for Bolpur SD respectively. Again, on the occasion of National Blood Donation Day 2011, we have organised a Workshop on Voluntary Blood Donor Motivation with the members of local Voluntary Organisation, Red Ribbon Clubs including the students of different colleges at Bolpur on 05.11.2011 in support of State Blood Transfusion Council of West Bengal.

7. AWARENESS PROGRAMMES ON HIV/AIDS

A. Folk Media Campaign against HIV/AIDS

AIDS has come to be the most pressing public health problem of this century. Despite of this fact that AIDS is a preventable disease, it is spreading rapidly all over the World in a speed which never witnessed before in case of any other public health disease. Unlike other public health disease, there is no cure for AIDS. The most important and effective strategy for controlling the spread of infection at present is through public education to bring about positive behaviour changes that emphasize safer sex and awareness of High-risk behaviour.

Communication is an important key to social and cultural development of a nation and the role of folk media in it cannot be overlooked. We need to make use of the folk media to educate the ignorant, illiterate superstitious segment of rural people and equally use interpersonal communication skill to sensitize and mobilize people to participate voluntarily and bring end to HIV/AIDS in India. In this year, the West Bengal State AIDS Prevention & Control Society has initiated a vast Mass Awareness campaign programme against HIV/AIDS by the help of different Folk Medias like Baul Songs, Magic Shows and Street Drama through out the State.

The troupes of these medias had earlier been imparted a training by NACO and SACS officials along with experts in the field of creative and performing arts. In our district, we were given the responsibility to conduct the pre-publicity campaign and supervise the entire Folk Media Campaign on HIV/AIDS through proper coordination with the campaign troupes and concerned health department of the district. The Folk Media Campaign on HIV/AIDS was launched in Birbhum on 14.02.2012 at Dubrajpur Municipality and ended on 21.02.2012 at Nanoor covering total 45 different places in rural and municipal areas of the following Blocks of Bolpur, Nanoor, Illambazar, Nalhati-I, Nalhati-II, Dubrajpur, Mohammad Bazar, Labpur in Birbhum District. Through this Folk Media Campaign, thousands of people in rural and urban people of respective Blocks were educated and aware on HIV/AIDS, and consequently, we have also got encouraging responses from them at every venue and on every performance.

B. Red Ribbon Clubs in Birbhum

Three years back a unique programme was launched by the West Bengal State AIDS Prevention & Control Society to boost up the fighting spirit against HIV/AIDS by involving the young generation in the awareness campaign against HIV/AIDS. Under this programme an action plan was made to form Red Ribbon Clubs at the Educational Institutions of our country. At that time, we were given the responsibility to form Red Ribbon Clubs at different Educational Institutions of our district in support of West Bengal State AIDS Prevention & Control Society.

During the previous 3 years, we have formed Red Ribbon Clubs with 50 student members at the several colleges of Birbhum like Purnidevi Choudhury Girls College, Bolpur, Kabi Joydev Mahavidyalaya, Illamabazar, Kabi Chandidas Mahavidyalaya, Khujutipara, Hiralal Bhakat College, Nalhati, Bengal Institute of Technology & Management, Bolpur, Dept. of Social Work, Visva Bharati, Rampurhat College, Rampurhat, Birbhum Mahavidyalaya, Suri, Sree Ramkrishna Silpa Vidyapith (Govt. Polytechnic College), Suri, Kabi Nazrul College, Murarai and Turku Hansda Lapsa Hembram Mahavidyalaya, Madian, Mollarpur. The student members of Red Ribbon Clubs have participating in every awareness campaign against HIV/AIDS in our district.

Through these seminar-cum-workshops, we have provided the RRC Member participants along with the general students of each college with the true knowledge of preventing the dreadful disease of HIV/AIDS including the way of making changes the behavioural attitude in an individual towards leading good quality of life. Beside that an initiation is taken to motivate the youth members of RRC for donating their blood voluntarily by removing their baseless fear and ignorance on blood donation and with proper information on blood components and blood transfusion. All those efforts were properly made with the help of IEC materials, books and slide show presentation by the representatives from our organisation.

C. Observation of World AIDS Day 2011; “GETTING TO ZERO”

With a clear & firm objective of ensuring AIDS free world, we, Santiniketan Ratanpalli Vivekananda Adibasi Kalyan Samity (SEVAKS) have observed the World AIDS Day 2011 through conducting a series of programmes comprising Mass Awareness Stall, Mass Awareness Rally, including Seminars and Quiz programmes on the same issue in Birbhum District.
